## PREVENTION TIPS

### Keep Your Business Crime-Free

- Install a security alarm, motion detectors, glass-break detectors and hold-up switches which are monitored by an alarm company.
- Place a surveillance camera that records behind the cash register, facing your front counter. Keep a low balance in your cash register. Don't leave cash overnight.
- Know who is in your business and where they are. Watch for people who hang around without buying anything.
- Keep all valuables locked in desks or lockers.
- Be aware of suspicious activity outside your place of business. Write down licence numbers of suspicious vehicles.
- Ensure outside entrances and inside security doors have deadbolt locks. Padlocks should be made of steel and kept locked at all times.
- Remove serial numbers from your locks to prevent unauthorized keys from being made.
- All outside or security doors should be metal (preferably steel) lined and secured with metal, security crossbars. Pin all exposed hinges to prevent removal.
- Ensure security bars or grates go to the top of the window they are securing. Reinforce them so they cannot be pulled off the exterior of the building by a vehicle.

- Descending roll shutters are more secure than security bars. However, they must be high quality, made of steel, and double-secured at the base
- All doors, windows, skylights or other entry points should be well lit.
- Practice Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) — keep trees and bushes trimmed, so they don't block outdoor lights.
- Keep store windows and doors clear of obstructions, displays and advertising. Having a clear view lets you monitor suspicious activity and see who is entering your business.
- Insist property owners install video surveillance to the exterior of the property. Install metal grates or reinforced steel bars on all windows and glass doors.
- Change your security codes and combinations if an employee has had access to your security system.
