GST for Not-for-Profits

GST is a difficult concept to understand in the not-for-profit world. A representative from the Federal GST Department will be in attendance to clarify the GST issues and answer any questions you have regarding your GST requirements or problems. Tax exempt programs and input tax credits will also be discussed. If you think your organization will reach \$50,000 in taxable revenues this year and you are not registered, you will have to register. If your government funding is at least 40% of your total revenue and you are not registered, you can still claim a rebate. Come to this workshop to gain clarity on this important topic.

GST for Charities

Charities are able to claim back 50% of GST paid. They don't have to register for GST unless they have \$250,000 in taxable revenue. A representative from

Partners in Planning (PIP)

The Partners in Planning Program (PIP) is an award-winning certificate program offered by the Federation of Calgary Communities in partnership with the City of Calgary. The program is geared towards helping community association planning volunteers and the public to develop skills for effective participation in the planning process. Participants who complete all three core courses and one elective receive a PIP completion certificate, which is signed by the Mayor and the President of the Federation.

Each Course:

- PIP courses are offered on Saturday mornings
- Light refreshments are provided
- You must register online at calgarycommunities.com
- There is always time for questions and networking

How it Works:

- A certificate is earned by completing four courses (three core, one elective)
- You may take any course as much as you like
- This is an ongoing program so there is no time limit to complete the requirements
- There are no pre-requisites and you may start with any course

Basics of Implementation Planning (Core Course)

Learn about the planning process and how to respond to development and land use applications circulated to your community. The MDP and CTP are covered in this course.
