Internal Controls and Financial Policies

Does your board have policies and procedures in place for finances? Do you or a member of your board sign blank cheques? Do you have numbered hall rental form and receipts? It will help you learn about internal controls and financial policies that should be in place to reduce the risk for theft, fraud and personal liability.

GST for Non-Profits

GST is a difficult concept to understand in the not-for-profit world. A representative from the Federal GST Department will be in attendance to clarify the GST issues and answer any questions you have regarding your GST requirements or problems. Tax exempt programs and input tax credits will also be discussed. If you think your organization will reach \$50,000 in taxable revenues this year and you are not registered, you will have to register. If your government funding is at least 40% of your total revenue and you are not registered, you can still claim a rebate. Come to this workshop to gain clarity on this important topic!

GST for Charities

Charities are able to claim back 50% of GST paid. They don't have to register for GST unless they have \$250,000 in taxable revenue. A representative from the Federal GST Department will be in attendance to clarify the GST issues and answer any questions you have regarding your GST requirements or problems.

Reading Financial Statements for Board Members

Did you know that you are liable if you approve a financial statement without understanding it? Do you feel intimidated by financial information presented at the board meetings? Do you want to know how to read financial statements better? Various types of financial statements will be reviewed and attendees will learn what type of questions to ask to ensure they understand the information presented.

Partners in Planning (PIP)

The Partners in Planning Program (PIP) is an award-winning certificate program offered by the Federation of Calgary Communities in partnership with the City of Calgary. The program is geared towards helping community association planning volunteers and the public to develop skills for effective participation in the planning process. Participants who complete all three core courses and one elective receive a PIP completion certificate, which is signed by the Mayor and the President of the Federation.

Each Course:

- PIP courses are offered on Saturday mornings
- Light refreshments are provided
- You must register online at calgarycommunities.com
- There is always time for questions and networking

How it Works:

- A certificate is earned by completing four courses (three core and one elective)
- You may take any course as much as you like
- This is an ongoing program so there is no time limit to complete the requirements
- There are no pre-requisites and you may start with any course

PIP: Understanding Planning & Design (Core Course)

Discover how policies that guide development in Calgary are created and applied. In this course learn more about these foundational documents such as the Municipal Development Plan (MDP), Developed Areas Guidebook and local area plans. Discover how these policies and others are applied to applications as they move through the approvals process.

Combined Workshop! Orientation to the Planning Process (OPP) 101 AND Planning Committees 101

OPP 101

Have you recently joined your planning committee or are you new to the planning process? This workshop will focus on the absolute basics to help get you started. Key learnings will include planning acronyms, policies, the hierarchy of plans, and the Land Use Bylaw. This workshop will help to increase your community's effective participation in the planning process and increase your community's knowledge of planning policy and rationale.

Planning Committees 101

Learn the basics on community association planning committees - how to get established and work effectively with other planning system stakeholders, whether you are an established community or a small group dealing with the occasional planning application. Key learnings will include planning governance, holding effective meetings, membership recruitment, and working with stakeholders. The workshop will help to improve your planning committee's governance and internal efficiency, as well as increase your knowledge of the role of planning committees in the planning process.


