

Toole Peet Action Grant Ideas 2022

Name	Your organization's idea
Alexandra Centre Society	We will be celebrating the 12 days of the Holidays by handing out free coffee and donuts to the citizens that walk past the Alexandra Dance Hall for an hour each morning just to make their day.
Arbour Lake Community Association	Our Community Association built an outdoor Fitness Park, near 55 Arbour Lake Drive N.W. and beside a City of Calgary Pathway in Arbour Lake, used year round. The only seating at the fitness park is on the ground. We would like to make a place by the Fitness Park to bring our neighbours together with a place to sit beside the Fitness Park and the paved pathway that passes by on the west side of the park. The Grant would be used to pay only or professional fees for a landscape planner to prepare a drawing acceptable to the City of Calgary for a place to have permanent year-round seating by the fitness park. The estimated cost for a plan by a professional landscape planner is \$1,000.
Banff Trail Community Association	We would like to purchase monogrammed reusable water bottles and give them away at our membership drive in March (Our memberships are free). Our Community Association is looking to reduce our carbon foot print and no longer offer one time use water bottles and juice boxes at our events.
Beltline Neighbourhoods Association	The BNA Board has a subcommittee of Beltline residents organizing a Community Fridge and Pantry between the Beltline Hub and Communitywise buildings. Insurance, permits and designs are prepared, now all we need are the funds to build a sturdy weather and graffiti proof pantry and the fridge itself! Community Fridges are popping up all across Calgary and the world to support low income residents with their food needs and it provides a great opportunity to engage residents in acts of mutual aid.
Bragg Creek Community Association	The Bragg Creek Community Association would like to use the funding from the Toole Peet Action Grant to restring our beautiful 50 foot spruce tree with outdoor commercial lighting to showcase at the annual Bragg Creek Spirit of Christmas & Light Up event to be held on Saturday, December 3rd. Volunteers will simultaneously light up an additional 12 trees throughout the community as the Bragg Creek community prepares to welcome visitors for the 2022 Christmas season.
Brentwood Community Association	We need to replace some benches in our community garden and would like to install buddy benches. With buddy benches, the general public could come and enjoy the garden throughout the growing season.
Calgary Climate Hub	The Calgary Climate Hub would like to host a networking event for the youth of Calgary interested in working in the Climate world and professionals who are currently working or have retired from the Climate World. In order to carry out this idea we need \$1000.00 for AV, advertising, marketing, snacks and an event planner.

Calgary Korean Women's Association	Calgary Korean Women's Association would like to create an inviting space for the community to meet and play in spaces. Due to COVID-19, we realized that mental health issue and food securities are our members' common issues. CKWA will create some cooking sessions to let everyone meet and learn about nutrition while maintain social activities at our center in North East Calgary. The budget includes \$750 for the food and \$250 for equipment. Everyone can join for free.
Calgary Region Airshed Zone Society	CRAZ would like produce and then offer 'Idle Free' signs to the community associations to install at their community buildings. Vehicle emissions are a leading source of air emissions in Calgary and stopping needless idling is one way to improve the air we breathe. We could produce approximately 30 signs for the grant amount.
Calgary Women's Soccer Association	As the only female soccer organization led by females, we strive to ensure we are accessible, inclusive, and equitable to all females. We are in the process of creating a tournament for newcomers to Calgary and would like to host a one-day jamboree for those new to Canada and introduce them to women's soccer.
Canyon Meadows Community Association	Canyon Meadows is a residential neighborhood in the SW quadrant of Calgary, Alberta. We are a vibrant community with an active Community Association and many dedicated volunteers that enrich the lives of our community members and the surrounding areas. Canyon Meadows was established in 1971, and we just recently celebrated our 51st Anniversary with a fantastic outdoor celebration where many of our community members took part. As our neighborhood was established over 50 years ago, so was the entrance sign, and although the community is vibrant and growth continues all around us, the sign is old and dated, and could really use a refresh! Over the past few years, this has been one of the most common questions; can we update our community entrance sign to better reflect the residents who live here. The CMCA would like to honor it's residents and provide a sign that we can all be proud of when entering our community! There are over 3500 residences in Canyon Meadows, so this sign will benefit each one of them. A modern new sign is important to welcome potential new buyers to the neighborhood, and also important for current residents to feel heard, appreciated and important. The projected total cost for this project will be \$15,000, which will be achieved though a community fundraiser, funding opportunities, and a substantial contribution from the Canyon Meadows CA.
Capitol Hill Community Association	We have a lovely outdoor sandbox, community garden and fire pits that have no seating for our community members or anyone to come and visit and also space for our seniors to sit and read, or families to sit and watch their kids play We would buy benches that turn into picnic tables so they can eat there too.

<p>Cedarbrae Community League Association</p>	<p>The Cedarbrae Community Centre has hosted a couple Jelly Bean dances since re-opening after the lifting of restrictions. These family fun events are a great way for children to have some fun in their community and offer the community an affordable activity the entire family can enjoy. Currently we are limited to how often we can offer these types of events as we have to rent all the sound / DJ equipment. We would like to expand our offerings to include youth dances, adult social nights and senior's events by purchasing sound equipment that can be used in place of renting the equipment each time.</p>
<p>Chaparral Community Association</p>	<p>We are working on putting together a skating rink in the neighbourhood and are looking to buy some additional supplies and some gift cards for volunteers.</p>
<p>Children's Commons Ecological Society</p>	<p>We would like to create a mud kitchen for the children that visit and play in Confederation Park. A mud kitchen is an area dedicated to imaginary play centred around mud and other natural materials. We would also use the funds to build a storage shed for all of the mud kitchen materials and miscellaneous items that would need to be tidied up occasionally.</p>
<p>Citadel Community Association</p>	<p>Thank you for this opportunity. We are in great need of the following items for our new community building.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. New water hoses to flood the rink. Our current hoses are falling apart and do not have much life left. Without these hoses we will not be able to continue to provide rink services to our community. 2. Chair dollies. We currently have no easy way to move our chairs around our community building for our renters. We are currently moving large volumes of chairs around one by one as needed. In addition, and our floors are getting scratched by renters moving chairs improperly
<p>Community Kitchen Program of Calgary</p>	<p>Last year we had our 5 ton truck stolen right off our property. This truck is vital, as we use it daily to pick up food/donations that support our clients facing food insecurity. We have just received our new truck, but are needing to put our logo and contact information on it. This a costly venture, but so important, as this is a way to continue to build awareness about who we are. We want our information to get into the hands of those that need it the most, as to the support and resources we are able to offer.</p>
<p>Crescent Heights Community Association</p>	<p>We are seeking to activate a forgotten green space into a natural area for play, discovery, rest, and reflection in East Crescent Heights. Drawing positive attention to the site from residents for engagement purposes and to gain traction with private fund raising options has been a challenge because the neglected Goose & Bear Hill is overgrown and unsightly. It does offer great views from 4 different vantage points and if we could introduce some seating elements such as a bench or two to attract attention to the development possibilities on the space it will mobilize a practical use of the unused potential of the hill.</p>

<p>Crestmont Home Owners Association</p>	<p>We would like to install a Community Book box: Take a book, leave a book Free Library. Crestmont Hall green area includes park benches, a great spot to sit, read and enjoy nature. The free library will motivate community members of all ages to enjoy the park and meet new people. The free library will inspire new readers, conversations, enrich the lives of our residents, and promote a sense of belonging. The funds will go toward materials, construction and installation of the library book box.</p>
<p>Dalhousie Community Association</p>	<p>We would like to develop a Community Pantry. The community pantry will be a micro-intervention to support food security in Dalhousie by providing on-demand, emergency food aid. A pantry cupboard would be set up where neighbours can drop off items, or pick them up as needed, at no cost. The goals of this pantry are to provide discrete food aid for people in the community, build connections between neighbours, and raise awareness about issues of food security.</p> <p>There are frequent reports of rising costs of living, increasing energy bills, and other expenses that may make it difficult for people to feed their families. These factors mean that a food pantry is an urgent need for all communities, especially with the Calgary Food Bank indicates that hunger disproportionately impacts children.</p> <p>While the pantry could provide emergency assistance, it is not intended to replace interventions such as the Calgary Food Bank.</p>
<p>Discovery Ridge Community Association</p>	<p>The association has a large c-can container located next to the community park that is used to collect donated bottles/can for recycling. The funds are used by the association for operating costs. We would like to get the container painted with a nature mural. We have engaged a local artist for a quote which comes to \$8,300, which includes artist's time and paint. The mural will make the container fit in with the park setting and beautify the area and will no longer be an eyesore. The mural will be point of pride in the community and hopefully brighten people's day.</p>
<p>Diversecities Communities Service Association</p>	<p>Diversecities has a long story of commitment and collaboration with the community of Calgary Chinatown. However, we all the changes that have happened in the last year, the community has not had enough opportunities to get together, enjoy and share ideas about the change in their need. We are looking to host an outdoor gathering to hear from community members what they need and how Diversecities can work toward meeting those community necessities.</p>
<p>Douglas Quarry Community Association</p>	<p>We need funding for our annual Holiday Light Up the Hood lighting contest. Funds would be used for advertising and creating awareness in the community and for prizes. We want the community to get involved and need some visibility for our association to attract new members and volunteers.</p>
<p>Dover community association</p>	<p>We are hope to in courage people to return to the community hall following Covid. We will start with a free breakfast with Santa to welcome them bad. This grant would cover food, possible sleigh ride, crafts and goody bags</p>

<p>East Village Neighbourhood Association (EVNA)</p>	<p>EVNA is looking to increase our supplies for events that we can store. Currently, when we have events we need to rent 10 x 10 pop-up tents, 6 x 30 tables, speaker systems and microphones, heaters, projector screens, chairs, coffee/hot water carafes and games (giant-size Jenga and cornhole are big hits!). As we work to stay inclusive and rarely charge for our events we host most of our events at a loss. If we were to have more readily available supplies we would take less of a loss and be able to host even more. These supplies would be for events like our annual Bike Day, Kite Day, Neighbour Day event, Harvest Garden Party, past pop-ups like our 2021 Pumpkin sale, as well as when we join established events like Pride or CMLC's Light Up the square. As East Village does not have a community hall, currently all of our events are outdoors within the community, activating our spaces and our neighbours! Any little bit that can help us achieve that is appreciated!</p>
<p>Elboya Britannia Community Association</p>	<p>We would love to have a kick off Ice Rink party!! Skating, ODR, Hockey, sledding and more!</p>
<p>Erin woods community association</p>	<p>Real cameras Fake cameras</p>
<p>Falconridge/Castleridge Community Centre</p>	<p>We would like to have a huge Christmas celebration just like in the past we use to but the last few years we have not been able to do it due to Covid. Our event will be on December 10/2022 and its called "Breakfast with Santa". This event is for the community of Castleridge and Falconridge, we will serve breakfast and hire a photographer and Santa with a decorated stage for the kids and family to have their professional pictures taken with the Santa. <p>Good Companions 50 Plus</p>	<p>We would like to invite our neighbourhood residents in Killarney to a Fun Paint Day at Good Companions in summer 2023. Participants will paint panels that will be attached to the chain link fence around our building. Painters will create images with the theme "community." Beverages and light snacks will be provided.</p>
<p>Hidden Valley Community Association</p>	<p>We are fundraising to replace a small playground in Hidden Valley. We are applying for a CFEP grant in January, but we have to have available matching funds of our own, which we are raising in part with a Bake Sale and a Craft Fair.</p>
<p>Highland Park Community Organization</p>	<p>We are looking to host a community outdoor skate day in February. We will have the Skate shake show up with skates for kids that do not own skates, and will provide hot-dogs and hot chocolate. We will also have our fire pits going to allow people to warm up.</p>

<p>Highwood Community Association</p>	<p>The Highwood Community Association / Highwood Outdoor Pool has been interested in purchasing indoor/outdoor movie equipment so that we can host Movie in the Hall, Park or Pool events throughout all seasons, both this year and into the future. Previously we have played old school "Jaws at the Pool" and other children's movies for "Movie in the Park" with rented equipment. These events have been well attended and are a great way to build community relationships, but fees for renting equipment do tend to add up. It would be so much nicer for our association to purchase equipment to help make this community activity sustainable while providing enjoyment for our area residents and those from surrounding communities on a regular basis... maybe even as a monthly kids activity.</p>
<p>Hillhurst Sunnyside Community Association</p>	<p>Winter Warmer outdoor event! Free community event to celebrate winter and create a warm space to gather with neighbours. Fire pits, heat lamps, hot drinks, music, and volunteer opportunities for youth.</p>
<p>Inglewood Community Association</p>	<p>We would like to build several benches for use around the ICA hall and our request for funding would be applied to the materials needed to construct and paint these benches. For the ICA, commercial outdoor seating is prohibitively expensive. Just a single bench purchased from a commercial supplier would be over \$1000, instead we plan to work with our community volunteers to build and paint the benches together. We would like to build eight benches, which would be placed to support our ice rinks, playground, field spaces, and for parents in our toddler play area. The materials cost for each bench is approximately \$110. This includes wood, hardware, fasteners, and paint supplies.</p>
<p>Inside Out Theatre</p>	<p>To commission a local Deaf artist to create a new mural for our community studio, and to hold a welcome back party as we go into our first in-person theatre season</p>
<p>Killarney Glengarry Community Association</p>	<p>KGCA has begun to execute on a strategy of annual events to build a sense of community in Killarney. To date we have held a Spring "Food Truck" event, a Fall "Community Safety Day" (with participation of first responders), and a Winter "Last Minute Christmas Market". We are applying for equipment to add a Summer "Movies in the Park" event to complete our annual cycle of community events</p>
<p>Kingsland Community Association</p>	<p>We are trying to raise additional funding to enclose the basement stairwell entrance for the safety of the children who attend preschool and other renters. We have a huge safety problem with street people using the stairwell for drug use, defecation, urination, used needles, etc. It is a costly initiative - our action plan to keep the community safe!</p>
<p>Lake Chaparral Residents' Association Ltd.</p>	<p>We are looking for funding to provide a new stove/oven for our Lakehouse Function Room! Our current one has been non-functional for quite some time - funding for a new one would help us immensely as we look to rejuvenate and better activate the space for events in the community!</p>

Marlborough Park Community Association	<p>We have recently been tagged on our building as well as our park vandalized and have come up with an idea of a mural. Local schools who have an art program will be approached to help us design and paint the mural. The key to this is to include the youth who we feel need to part of this project to be proud of their community.</p> <p>We will be looking at approaching high schools and colleges to help us design and paint the image together.</p>
Martindale community association	Youth sized hockey skates to have on hand to loan to novice skaters
Millican Ogden Community Association	<p>Millican Ogden and the Jack Setter arena have contracts for once a day snow removal of the sidewalks surrounding the community centre and arena. If it continues to snow throughout the day the arena staff are to continue with maintaining the sidewalks. Many years ago a large used industrial rotating brush was donated to assist the arena staff in clearing snow from sidewalks in the winter and gravel from the parking lot in the summer. That was several years ago and the well-used brush is creating safety issues for walkers, joggers, participants, children going to school and our furry four legged friends.</p> <p>The brush while pushing the snow forward actually just packs and polishes the snow creating build-up and a slick surface. With the recent snowfalls the extensive sidewalk became so slippery with the freezing temperature people started walking out on the road which is a safety issue.</p> <p>What would be a good solution would be to purchase a plow that would attach to the front of our ride on (grass cutter) that all staff could operate regardless of physical size or disability. The plow is \$2,000.</p> <p>We are asking for financial assistance of \$1,000 to not only assist in making the sidewalks and walk ways safer but to help us save our savings to make some very necessary renovations to our mostly original (60+ year old) buildings.</p>
Millrise Community Association	<p>We would like to have a winter community event with our outdoor rink.</p> <p>Skating and Smores was an event we held last year in conjunction with SECA.</p> <p>Family skate, fire pits, hot chocolate, games</p>
Montgomery Community Association	For 2023, we are planning to bring back events each month. Of these events, we will have ones for seniors and children. Our idea is to have 2 ping pong tables we can bring out and set up when events are happening and they can play, create a team, but mostly for fun and to be active. The tables can be used for our Monty pub nights as well and engage folks to play as well as socialise, but the goal is to bring all ages together and have fun.
Montgomery Community Association	We would love to be able to purchase 2 table tennis tables, so that we can use them for our new seniors social programming and for our children's activities and community events.

MPC Foundation	<p>The primary mission of our organization is to mitigate or prevent social isolation for seniors. This Christmas, we need additional support for seniors as needs have relentlessly increased while our resources have not. At Christmas we target the delivery of Christmas care bags to those seniors who live alone or are without family members and no social network. Seniors in particular have been severely impacted by rising cost of essentials. For Christmas, at least, we hope to provide them some reprieve and be able to enjoy the season.</p>
New Brighton Community Association	<p>After this long pandemic we want to put an event or two to reconnect with the community. We had an event "Hot chocolate with the Board" that took place in the park and was really nice and we would like to have one or two other events like that with hot chocolate, coffee, popcorn and few outdoor games to get people to know us better and maybe get more residents on our Board. Thank you for offering us this opportunity.</p>
New Brighton Community Association	<p>We want to engage more with our residents, to get to meet them again. We had a "Hot chocolate with the Board" in the park this February and we would like to put one or two more events like that. Thanks.</p>
North Haven Community Association	<p>The North Haven Community is in the process of building a community garden to bring together community members in a shared love of gardening. We are excited to report that the garden is currently under construction and community members will be able to start planting their garden plots in spring 2023! To help make gardening financially accessible to community members, we want to provide tools for plot owners to use. Additionally, we need to construct fencing around the garden to keep foraging animals out of the plots. The Toole Peet Action Grant would be used to purchase gardening tools, hoses, and fencing for our much anticipated community garden.</p>

<p>Northstar Residents Association Ltd.</p>	<p>We run a youth volunteer program called Youth Council that empowers youth to make a difference in the community. Youth Council has been instrumental in helping make our community events a success. We are seeking this grant on behalf of our Youth Council for 3 actions.</p> <p>First, Volunteer Activities (\$400). Youth Council leads special efforts to enhance the community thru volunteer efforts. These activities include but aren't limited to clean up drives, historic tours/walks, and community gatherings like game nights. These ongoing activities are bolstered by providing resources like snacks and water or purchasing/renting equipment.</p> <p>Second, Volunteer Training (\$300). We love to further empower our volunteers with unique skills thru training, such as First Aid classes.</p> <p>Finally, Community Event (\$300). Our community events tend to focus on either adults or little children but not teens. Teens are a demographic that are hard to plan for but that's no excuse to be ignored. Therefore, Youth Council has taken up the challenge to organize events/activities for their peers. Youth Council is putting together a Youth Winter Festival to bring warmth to the usual cold start of the year by celebrating the Spirit of Youth. This event will be part of a growing effort to engage with more members of our community through a tradition of celebration.</p>
<p>Ogden House Senior Citizens Club</p>	<p>Our chairs are falling apart in the auditorium we would like to buy a folding one. We use these chairs a lot for many different programs. The fund will be a big help.</p>
<p>Palliser-Bayview-Pumphill Community Association</p>	<p>We are having a lot of difficulty getting our message of engagement out to our community. While we have a website, FB and Instagram followers to advertise events, calls for volunteers, and community news, we simply do not have enough contact information for our 7,000 residents to meet our engagement mission. In addition, our membership growth efforts have not been successful. We currently have 157 active members in our database. In order to get our message out, we would like to work with the local girl and boy scout groups to canvass the homes in our communities. The groups would offer free 1-year PBPCA community memberships in exchange for their email and contact information. For their efforts, we would pay the Boy and Girl Scouts \$0.50 for each new verified contact to a maximum of 2,000 new memberships (\$1,000).</p>
<p>Pineridge Community Association</p>	<p>Funds would be used toward a family community event on Dec10th, Lunch with Santa. Lunch, activities and entertainment will be provided for all attendees.</p>
<p>Ranchlands Community Association</p>	<p>Ice-cream Dance Party. Music DJ, light show, hotdogs & Ice-cream with all the toppings</p>
<p>Rosemont Community Association</p>	<p>We would like to host a family movie night in February or March 2023, free to members of the community association. All members who live in the community get a free membership. The amount requested includes licensing, movie purchase, and popcorn/snacks. We are hoping to host up to 100 people. Covid has reduced the level of community involvement and we are hoping that we can bring some families together for a fun night.</p>

<p>Rosscarrock Community Association</p>	<p>I would like to start hosting Fireside chats this winter and provide Hot Chocolate, Coffee, Tea, Marshmallows for roasting and a supply of roasting sticks for community members. The grant money would also be used to help keep us in a supply of firewood to host these fireside chats once a week during the winter months. It would be away to bring our community out and meet people and build connections through socialization. This be once a week every week throughout the winter 4 or 5 months so approx. 20 weeks</p>
<p>Saddle Ridge Community Association</p>	<p>One stretch of white fences (18 houses) that are next to a green pathway, will be painted. We will need an artist, paint and some maintenance fund so that this lasts a few years.</p>
<p>Sandstone MacEwan Community Association</p>	<p>We would like to offer indoor yoga starting in mid January 2023 for ten weeks. It would be free for members or a \$10 drop in fee for non-members. We did offer this in April 2022 for the first time and it was quite popular with about 40 different people attending about 20 people a week. We rent the location Salvation Army gym and hire a yoga instructor. We also advertised with an outdoor sign. The total cost last year from \$1850.</p>
<p>Scenic Acres Community Association</p>	<p>The Scenic Acres Community Association seeks to improve the electrical capacity of the Scenic Acres Community Centre, which is the public hub in our community of over 3,000 households. The building is routinely used for community gatherings and events like the Stampede Breakfast, Children's Ice Cream Summer Celebration, etc. However, our current electrical capacity (plugs and breakers) is limited and the operation of fun inflatable games like a bouncy castle overloads our system and trips breakers. Our proposal is to add outlets on breakers of sufficient amperage (we have confirmed the this can be done within the capacity) to allow the operation of fun toys and games for young participants to enjoy.</p>
<p>Shawnee Evergreen Community Associaton (SECA)</p>	<p>SECA is building a neighbourly community. One of our initiatives to build neighbourliness is community campfires because campfires have the magical power to break down barriers and encourage conversations between residents. We plan to boost attendance by adding special ingredients; LIVE MUSIC and food. SECA plans to host at least 3 campfires in 2023. With the support of this grant we could include live music! #PlayLocal SECA has no community building of any kind. We have no hub to gather around which to gather so bringing people together at events is more important for us and more challenging.</p>
<p>Silver Springs Community Association</p>	<p>We are hosting our 2nd "Hello Winter" celebration on December 17th outdoors here at Silver Springs Community Center. We are expecting roughly 600+ attendees. On this day we will have skating at our outdoor community rinks, a visit from Santa, wagon rides, tobogganing, crafts, snacks, hot chocolate and local entertainers.</p>

Silverado Community Association	We would like to offer our members and the residents of our community more events that allow us to come together as neighbours. Since we have little funding and are working on developing our member base, we rely on sponsors to fund our events. However, it's been difficult since COVID to entice sponsors to make donations to our association. Our next event is Santa is Coming to Silverado! on December 11th. Held at our local pub, it draws a crowd because we offer food, but the food can be costly.
Southview Community Association	We'd love a projector and a screen to run free movie nights for the kids in our neighborhood.
Southwood Community Association	In Southwood crime is on the rise and much of this crime is taking place in dark back laneways. We would like to implement a pilot project where we install solar motion censored lights to properties backing onto laneways. We believe light is a great solution to deter crime, and this would be an amazing initiative to bring community members to take ownership of their property and public spaces surrounding them. We would like to begin by focusing on a laneway that has a 14 foot sound wall to the north, making this area a perfect place for crime and drug use to occur. We would be looking for the entire \$1000. We would like to purchase and install 50 motion sensed solar lights and this funding would help subsidize the costs.
