WHERE TO START

1 Choose Your Location

You can host an event in your front yard, backyard, in a park or even apply to host a block party on a residential street! If you choose to host an event on private property, no permit is required! Events held on streets or in parks require a permit, but don't worry, Block Party and Green Space permits are free for Neighbour Day!



Neighbour Day events can happen between 10am and 10pm if they are on a public street or in a park. Consider the people that live in your neighbourhood and try to offer a time range that people can attend. **Fund Your Event**



PERMITS YOU MIGHT NEED



Block Party Permit

What's it For:

• Blocking off a public street for activities

What You Need To Apply:

• A petition signed by the majority of the residents on the affected block

Cost:

• FREE on Neighbour Day

Apply at least 15 days before your event.



Greenspace Permit

What's it For:

• Booking a park, pathway or greenspace for an event

Cost:

• FREE on Neighbour Day

Apply at least 30 Days before your event.



Street Use Permit

What's it For:

- to exclusively use any City road right-of-way, that is, a street, a sidewalk, an alley, a walkway, a back lane, or a boulevard
- Paint the pavement projects require a street use permit.

What is it:

• Up to \$2,500 for small-scale, free-to-attend Neighbour Day events.

Eligability:

 Community Associations, Buisness Improvement Areas & Other Non-profits

Deadline August 31, 2025

What is it:

 Up to \$5,000 to help local non-profits celebrate arts & culture

Eligibility:

 Community Associations, Business Improvement Areas & Other Non-profits

ActivateYYC

What is it:

• Up to \$5,000 for placemaking initatives

Eligability:

 Community Associations, Buisness Improvement Areas & Other Non-profits

Weather

Be prepared for different weather on the day of your event. Tents or tarps can be great for providing shade or shelter from rain.



Engagement Opportunity



This is a great opportunity to show the community what you do! Don't just host the event; be part of it. Talk to people about the organization, be able to talk about the work you do and be ready to sell memberships if folks are interested.
