




# WHERE TO START

# **1** Choose Your Location

You can host an event in your front yard, backyard, in a park or even apply to host a block party on a residential street! If you choose to host an event on private property, no permit is required! Events held on streets or in parks require a permit, but don't worry, Block Party and Green Space permits are free for Neighbour Day!



Neighbour Day events can happen between 10am and 10pm if they are on a public street or in a park. Consider the people that live in your neighbourhood and try to offer a time range that people can attend. 5 Fund Your Event

How will you pay for this event? Will neighbours chip in? Will you fundraise? Keep this in mind when you are planning your event.





# **Block Party Permit**

#### What's it For:

• Blocking off a public street for activities

#### What You Need To Apply:

• A petition signed by the majority of the residents on the affected block

#### Cost:

• FREE on Neighbour Day

#### Apply at least 15 days before your event.



### **Greenspace Permit**

#### What's it For:

• Booking a park, pathway or greenspace for an event

#### Cost:

• FREE on Neighbour Day

#### Apply at least 30 Days before your event.





# **Street Use Permit**

#### What's it For:

- to exclusively use any City road right-of-way, that is, a street, a sidewalk, an alley, a walkway, a back lane, or a boulevard
- Paint the pavement projects require a street use permit.

# KEEP IN MIND



## Food & Drink

While Alberta Health Services guidelines don't apply to potlucks, following food safety guidelines is the best way to keep people safe. Also, keep in mind that alcohol can't be consumed on public property. Find information on <u>hosting healthy potlucks here.</u>
